



The Chilean Gendarmerie (Judicial Police of Chile) is Chile's national prison service. This armed service belongs to the Ministry of Justice.

**Special units:**

**Sección Armamento y Munición - SAM (Armament and Ammunition Section)**

Created by decree of Justice # 355 of January 25, 1966. Its responsibilities include the distribution and control of arms, ammunition and chemicals, and the maintenance of weapons.

**Sección Prevención Eventos Críticos - SPEC (Critical Events Prevention Section)**

Main task: the prevention of critical events, such as disasters natural, fires, floods, in the precincts where Gendarmerie of Chile has the function of monitoring and control. When things go wrong SPEC coordinates the distribution of equipment and fire safety features nationally in its field of competence.

**Centro Especial Adiestramiento Canino - CEAC (Special Canine Training Center)**

This unit specializes in training dogs for surveillance, drugs and explosives detection.

**Sección de Operaciones Tácticas - SOT (Tactical Operations Section)**

The Tactical Operations Section is a specialized team created in March 1996. It specializes in tactical intervention, hostage-taking, riots, mass escapes, and other events that threaten the security of prisons.

**Unidad de Servicios Especiales Penitenciarios - USEP (Special Unit of Correctional Services)**

Grupo Especial Antimotines - GEAM (Riot Task Force)

Grupo Especial de Traslado - GET (Transfer Task Force)

USEP is the result of a merger between GEAM and GET. It is responsible for the transfer of defendants and convicted both in the metropolitan area and nationally, either at the disposal of the respective courts and transfer of criminal and special units, as well as mass movements of prison population. The Task Force also reacts to situations of internal disturbance in prisons.

**Rehabilitation Centers:**

Nationally there are 37 social rehabilitation centers, located in Arica, Iquique, Antofagasta, Calama, Copiapo, Vallenar, La Serena, Ovalle, Quillota, Quilpué, Valparaíso, Los Andes, San Antonio, Rancagua, San Fernando, Curicó, Talca, Linares, Cauquenes, Chillán, Concepción (Bio-Bio), Los Angeles, Cañete, Angol, Temuco, Valdivia, Osorno, Puerto Montt, Castro, Coyhaique, Punta Arenas, Santiago, Santiago Sur, Santiago Poniente, Santiago East.
